INTRODUCTION OF LOW SEASON GORILLA AND CHIMPANZEE PERMIT RATES AND REVISED TARIFF STRUCTURE

On behalf of the Uganda Wildlife Authority (UWA), I am pleased to inform you about important updates regarding our permit pricing structure, including the introduction of low season rates and suspension of the 7-day reservation,

1. Introduction of Low Season Permits.

UWA has introduced discounted low season rates applicable during the months of April, May, and November as follows:

Activity	FNR (USD)	FR (USD)
Gorilla Tracking	600	500
Chimpanzee Tracking	200	150

These rates take immediate effect and are intended to stimulate travel during the low season while maintaining Uganda's exceptional primate tracking experience. Please note that the low season permits cannot be rescheduled.

2. Revised Tariff Structure

UWA is also announcing the following tariff adjustments that will take effect on 1st July 2026

3. Suspension of 7 Day Reservation window.

The current seven (7) day reservation window within the booking and revenue collection system has been suspended effective 1st March 2026. Previously, operators were able to reserve permits for up to seven days without payment, after which unpaid reservations were automatically cancelled by the system. Going forward, the system will only allow operators to secure permits upon full payment at the time of booking, thereby completing the transaction instantly. This measure is intended to improve permit availability, enhance fairness and transparency in allocation, and ensure that permits remain accessible to operators with confirmed clients, ultimately allowing more efficient planning and equitable access across the industry.

These changes are part of UWA's continued commitment to sustainable conservation financing, improved visitor experiences, and strengthened collaboration with our stakeholders. We appreciate your continued partnership and support in promoting Uganda as a premier primate tourism destination.
